The arrangements for Sunday and weekday Masses seem to be working quite well thanks in large part to those who act as stewards in monitoring safety and ensuring the cleaning of our churches after each gathering. Thank you all.

The times of public Masses will remain as they are for the present.

It is strange, I know, for Holy Communion to be administered after Mass, but we must bear with it. May I emphasise though that if you do go to Holy Communion you should then proceed out of the church reverently, making an Act of Thanksgiving. Apart from the risk of irreverence, the safeguarding measures we have to make are somewhat negated if people then congregate, chattering to each other.

You may well have heard by now the news that St Mary's School Shaftesbury has closed. Many of our parishioners have been associated with the school over the years as pupils, parents, teachers and governors. I am personally sad that I shall no longer be making visits to St Mary's to hear confessions which always included a lovely meal and conversation beforehand with some members of the staff.

This week I had to tell Sr Olga of St Elisabeth's Convent in Belarus that it did not seem possible to welcome the Sisters, as we have done on a couple of occasions in the past, for a visit which they proposed in August. I don't think that it would have been worth their while in the present situation to come with their icons etc for sale. This morning I looked up St Elisabeth's Convent, Minsk and I recommend that you have a look. I am not aware of any enterprise undertaken by a single community in the Western Church which is quite as extensive and inspiring as their work as described; promoting the Gospel and caring for the poor, with facilities in various places for vulnerable women and children. prisoners, the mentally ill....the list goes on.

We could do with some of this. The only way we can get it is to allow the Holy Spirit to enter into our lives so that we become properly and completely dedicated to Christ, his Church and his people; then we might see miracles here.

Public Mass at Our Lady's and St Benedict's. What can we expect when coming to mass at Marnhull and Gillingham? Mass will be a different experience, but much has been put in place to make our churches a safe and welcoming place to worship. Below is a guide to what to expect and procedures that will be in place:

- When coming to church household groups will be expected to maintain a safe distance (preferably 2 metres) **and wear a face covering.**
- There will be no holy water.
- There is a sanitising gel dispenser in the porch which must be used before entering church.
- Stewards will be on duty and will seat each household group starting at the front and only one household group per pew. Please seat away from the aisle
- Track and Trace: Each household group will be asked to complete a contact form listing all household group members attending mass with contact details. (These forms will be kept for 21 days then destroyed).
- There will be no mass books or hymn books.
- The Sign of Peace is not exchanged.
- No hymns and no moving from the pews during mass.
 Toilets will not be available neither will refreshments after mass.
- The Eucharist will be distributed at the end of mass as you leave church.
 Father will be at the back of the church and maintaining a safe distance with outstretched arms to receive communion.
 - Communion will be given as you leave mass starting with the back rows. We are asked to maintain a safe distance at all times and depart immediately without congregating outside the church.
- Some pews in the church are blocked off to maintain social distancing.
- Anyone with a mobility problem moving around the church, wishing to attend Mass at Our Lady's, should phone Steve Carrivick, on 07887 988123 to help him prepare a place for you.
- Please advise a steward if you would like to be added to the newsletter email distribution list. The church will be cleaned after each mass with sanitising cleanser.

Private prayer sessions. To reduce the burden of the hard-working stewards and cleaners essential at each session, there will be no further facility for private prayer at Our Lady's during the current restrictions, now that Mass is celebrated at each church on a weekday. However, the session on Fridays at St. Benedict's from 10.am to 11.00.am will continue for the time being. A heartfelt 'thank you' to those volunteers undertaking this service to us all.

There will be Holy Rosary at 6.00.pm this Friday (17th) on Zoom., organised by Deacon Michael, and **coffee morning** at 12.15pm this Sunday. If you'd like to join in, please contact Deacon Michael or Tony Moore for the usual meeting I.D. and password.
