In this awful situation in which we find ourselves it is heartening that people, parishioners and neighbours are displaying so much warmth and charity towards each other. This is expressed in many ways. For example, I am personally overwhelmed with gratitude for the gifts of foodstuffs which have appeared on my doorstep- and the many offers to provide more! I am grateful as well to those who have put forward ideas about how to sustain the parish financially while there are no Sunday Masses. There are details about how to make a standing order or make your contribution in other ways on the website, I know. We are so fortunate that God has raised up many people with so much talent which enables the spirit of the parish to be maintained: lots are engaged in programmes in their locality to assist the elderly and needy and there are those who keep communication in place with the digital newsletter and the parish website. There's no shortage of information which can be used to develop and enhance our spiritual life and to help each other.
